Every month the bulletin will give you 10 ways out of the top 100 to try.....let's see if they work!

- 1. Meet at a good location.
- 2. Assign every member to a 5-person recruitment team—each team brings in a new member every six months
- 3. Develop a strategic plan membership is a year-round priority and needs to be planned
- 4. Have incentives for recruitment
- 5. Have a large poster that lists all the members who have sponsored a new member in the past year
- 6. Seek out diversity
- 7. Display a thermometer showing progress towards club goal
- 8. Feature a member's "benefit of the month" in the club newsletter
- 9. Induct new members with pizzas & invite spouse/partner
- 10. Develop a welcome letter from the president for all new members.

The PIFF manual says:

Scholarships are given to applicants interested in pursuing careers in one of the areas Pilot focuses on: Transforming communities through education and service in the areas of youth leadership and development, brain safety and fitness, or caring for families in need.

What is your college student looking for? There are scholarships for graduating seniors and full-time undergraduates, one for persons improving their careers or reentering the job market, one for international students only and one for graduate students. You'll find these described on our Pilot International website.

Applications are made online at https://www.pilotinternational.org. The form can be found under Pilot Founders Fund, then choose Scholarships. **Application must be postmarked by March 15.**

Pilot International Founders Fund

Pilots, did you realize that our International club was started because civic minded ladies were not included in men's clubs?

The year was 1921. World War I had ended. Women had the vote. Enthusiasm and excitement energized the nation, and newly empowered women were eager to claim their rightful place as leaders in a modern American society.

Inspired by the efforts of the men around her - watching them gather together to form their own civic organizations - Georgia native Elizabeth Leonard and six of her friends met in early September to discuss a brave and hopeful new idea – the formation a volunteer service organization of businesswomen that could one day become international in its scope of service.

Thus begins the article about PIFF on our International website. Some of us remember the years when we had a separate Foundation for donor funds. When the organization was revamped into a single entity, our leaders chose to honor our Founders by naming our umbrella of grant funds for them. Thus, we have **Pilot International Founders Fund** (PIFF).

Several funds are included in this catch-all name. They cover grants to clubs, districts and students. Funds for students in leadership go to Anchors. Endowment funds sustain Pilot International. Other funds support brain-related research and a list of general needs.

Of particular interest this year with our storms and floods is the Safe Harbor Fund. Monies held in this fund are specifically for disaster relief.

Where does that money come from? September is Founder's month. To celebrate, clubs are encouraged to choose an outstanding member and honor them as Ambassador of their club. A donation of \$25 is sent to Pilot International in the name of their Ambassador and they are listed in The Pilot Log for all to see. These contributions are specifically earmarked for the Safe Harbor Fund.
