The information that follows describes the **Pilot Club of Charleston's** various service projects. Connie White was kind enough to provide the information below.

Annually the Pilot Club of Charleston is pleased to be able to award a \$5,000 scholarship to a nursing student at the University of Charleston (formerly Morris Harvey College), a small private university located in the center of Charleston, WV. The Pilot Club of Charleston has provided this scholarship to the School of Nursing since the 1970's. The scholarship's intention is to provide financial assistance to an undergraduate student preparing for a career in nursing. The nursing profession was chosen as it ties in to the Pilot International mission of "encouraging brain safety and health and supporting those who care for others." The Director of the UC School of Nursing and often the actual scholarship recipient attends our spring meeting. It is gratifying to know we have made a difference in advancing the career goals of a nursing student while furthering our Pilot International mission.

In keeping with the PI mission, we also support these worthy projects:

- \$500 annually to the Children's Therapy Clinic. This nonprofit provides comprehensive therapy to children with disabilities including autism, traumatic brain injury and neurological disorders. We have been able to continue this donation for over ten years.
- -\$1000 annually to the Kanawha County Schools Dental Clinic. In the 1950's a Pilot Club of Charleston member whose dentist husband volunteered with the KCS (Kanawha County Schools) program started this annual donation and we have been able to continue it ever since. The KCS Dental Clinic provides preventive and restorative dentistry services to students. They operate five dental clinics throughout the county.

Phishing:

- **Definition:** Deceptive emails designed to trick recipients into divulging sensitive information.
- Intent: To steal personal data like passwords, credit card numbers, or financial information.
- Harm: Can lead to identity theft, financial loss, or malware infections.
